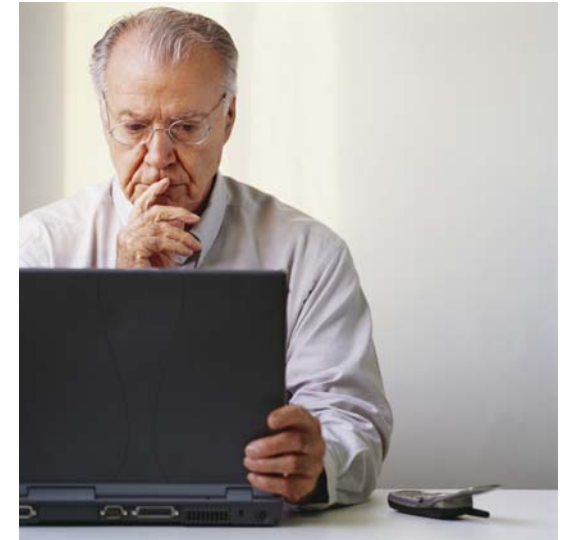

BCA Seniors' Computer Group

The formation of the Group was the initiative of the Burdekin Community Association Inc. (BCA).

Seniors' Support Service Co-ordinator, Robert Lesca and the Group functions as one of the BCA services to the Burdekin Community.

Whilst many young people have grown up with information technology, research shows that senior persons (over forty years) are far less likely to have even basic computer skills or to be able to use the internet.

The aim of the Seniors' Computer Group is:

- ◆ To foster and encourage computer awareness and literacy among the senior members of the community.
- ◆ To facilitate computer training for its members and other senior members of the community (subject to available trainers, equipment and finances)
- ◆ To encourage a peer group network to assist each other with computer use and problems.



Membership

Membership is open to senior members of the community. Membership fees are due in September each year.
